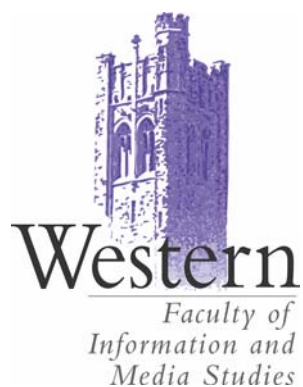

**2003 Placement Survey of MLIS Graduates
Faculty of Information and Media Studies
The University of Western Ontario**

SUMMARY

Of the 95 students who graduated from the Master of Library and Information Science program in 2003, 37 graduates completed the placement survey. This represents an overall response rate of 38.9%.

Placement Rate

Of the 37 respondents, 34 reported finding employment, representing a 91.9% placement rate. Approximately 90% of students who were employed stated they were working in positions related to the MLIS degree. Three quarters of graduates were employed in full-time positions.

Types of Placement and Job Assignment

Graduates were employed in many different types of organizations, the most common being a public library (23.5%). The most common primary job assignment reported was reference or information services (23.5%).

Salary

Graduates with full-time positions reported a salary range from \$24,000 to \$52,000. The median salary was \$40,000.

Location of Placement

The majority of graduates reported being employed in Ontario (67.6%). Three graduates reported employment outside of Canada.

Length of Job Search

Approximately 35% of graduates reported finding employment before completing the MLIS degree. Almost 53% were employed in six months (or less) after graduation.

Skill or Knowledge Most Influential in Securing Employment

The two skills graduates cited as most influential in securing employment were subject specialization (cataloguing, reference, business, science, etc.) (36.7%) and co-op experience (26.7%).
